Airport Authority Application



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- Aviation activities commenced in the 1950s.
- North Shore Aero Club was incorporated in 1963.
- Today the site is known as North Shore Airport and has been in existence in one way, shape or form for over 60 years.
- North Shore Aero Club Incorporated is still the owner of North Shore Airport.



- Home to many Kiwi owned businesses.
- Scores of Kiwis are employed both directly and indirectly as a direct result of North Shore Airport's existence.
- Provides strategic regional transport links.
- 200+ Kiwis engaged in tertiary education at any given time.
- Approx 100 tenants.
- Approx 600 members.



- Strategic location for Emergency Medical Services (EMS).
- Westpac Rescue (Auckland Rescue Helicopter Trust).

What is an Airport Authority?



The rights available to an airport authority are restrained and controlled by local and central government decision-making, so as to protect the interests of the wider community in which they serve.



The Airport Authorities Act (1966) allows for organisations to establish, improve, maintain, operate and manage airports to modern standards.



It provides a range of mechanisms that enable airports to develop in a more fluid, practical and sustainable manner.



It obligates the airport to operate in a transparent manner such as disclosing fees charged for aircraft movements and passenger levies.



An Airport Authority can make its own bylaws (which must be approved by government).



An Airport Authority can acquisition land (but only with approval from the Minister of Lands).



An Airport Authority can apply to the Minister for the Environment for requiring authority status under the Resource Management Act.



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Why become an Airport Authority?



North Shore Airport has applied for Airport Authority status primarily to reinforce its position and current status as an airport.



Airport Authority status reinforces and complements the zoning of North Shore Airport, under the North Shore Airport Precinct of the Auckland Unitary Plan (Operative in Part).



Airport Authority status assists in keeping pace with the changing legislative and operational requirements necessary for the management of a modern airport.



It will help North Shore Airport integrate with and support the future business and industrial urbanisation of the surrounding area in accordance with the Auckland Unitary Plan.



In short, the Act exists to support modern airport management and operations.



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Are There Plans for Expansion?



North Shore Aero Club exists for its members ultimately.

Although the community is very close second in priority.



North Shore Aero Club will NOT be benefiting its members with excessive volumes of commercial traffic.



There are plans for modest expansion.



A modest expansion means:

- Enhanced safety.
- Some additional regional transport links, although limited in number.



A modest expansion means:

- Added value to the community.
- More businesses.
- More jobs.
- Investment in the local area.
