I refer to your email dated 29 October 2024, requesting the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

"All written communications between Drive Electric and the Ministry of Transport since 1 January 2024, with respect to the Clean Car Discount and/or the Clean Car Standard

Any emails from Drive Electric to the Ministry of Transport with regard to the changes to the Clean Car Standard".

Two documents fall within the scope of your request and are detailed in the document schedule attached as Annex 1. The schedule outlines how the documents you requested have been treated under the Act.

Certain information is withheld under the following sections of the Act:

9(2)(a) to protect the privacy of natural persons

With regard to the information that has been withheld under section 9 of the Act, I am satisfied that the reasons for withholding the information at this time are not outweighed by public interest considerations that would make it desirable to make the information available.

You have the right to seek an investigation and review of this response by the Ombudsman, in accordance with section 28(3) of the Act. The relevant details can be found on the Ombudsman's website <u>www.ombudsman.parliament.nz</u>

With respect to the CCS review, we are currently putting together a project timeline for the Minister to review. However, I can advise that if there are any proposed changes to the targets through legislation, at a minimum there will be public consultation at the select committee stage.

With respect to your questions about RUC being charged on EVs, I have forwarded these to Matt Skinner who manages the Revenue team.

On your question "are you doing any modelling on projected uptake of EVs, given the various changes to policy settings?", the Ministry periodically models and publishes information on vehicle uptake, and we expect that information will be reflected in the next model when it is published.

Hi James, The Minister has instructed the Ministry to proactively release the briefing provided to the Minister following the review of the Clean Car Standard. The Minister also instructed us release the Cabinet paper, RIS, and CIPA. These documents are available here. In the Cabinet paper you will see the policy recommendations to Cabinet (which I can confirm is now government policy). With respect to your question on changes to credits and penalties, these require changes to primary legislation.
