

Funding allocation and support for local boards

55 Auckland Council will need to determine how to allocate funding to enable local board decision-making. Currently, local boards have access to a Local Board Transport Capital Fund. The value of this fund for the 2024/25 year is \$20 million across the 21

local boards. In addition to this, for the functions allocated to local boards funding that currently sits with Auckland Transport will need to be transferred to local boards.

56 Where co-funding is enabled from the National Land Transport Fund (NLTF) for projects, there is some complexity at play. ^{s 9(2)(f)(iv)}

It will need to be made clear to local boards which decisions (if made) will require 100% local funding.









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
APPENDIX B - FREIGHT AND PUBLIC TRANSPORT NETWORKS ON LOCAL ROADS





TRANSPORT GOVERNANCE REFORM IN AUCKLAND – ADDITIONAL DECISIONS TO INFORM DRAFTING

Background

- 1 In December 2024, Cabinet agreed to progress legislation to reform transport governance and planning arrangements in Auckland, with the aim of increasing democratic accountability for transport decision-making and strengthening the role of Government and Auckland Council in long-term integrated transport planning. This followed a process of engagement between the previous Minister of Transport and the Mayor of Auckland.
- 2 The reforms mark the most significant changes to governance arrangements in Auckland since the Auckland Council amalgamation of 2010.
- 3 We have attached the Cabinet Minute for your reference [CAB-24-MIN-0471.02 refers]. In summary the reforms:
 - move transport policy, planning and road controlling authority (RCA) functions from Auckland Transport to Auckland Council;
 - s 9(2)(f)(iv)
 - establish an Auckland Regional Transport Committee (ARTC), with voting members comprising Ministerial appointees and Auckland Council elected members, responsible for developing a 30-year integrated transport plan for the region; and
 - allocate specific transport decision-making to Auckland Council's 21 local boards.
- 4 To enact these reforms, changes are required to the Local Government (Auckland Council) Act 2009 (LGACA), that sets out the current framework for transport governance and management in Auckland. Consequential amendments are required to the Land Transport Management Act 2003, the Land Transport Act 1998 and a number of other Acts.

Cabinet authorised the Minister of Transport to make decisions consistent with the overall policy intent during drafting and, in particular, authorised you to make decisions on the so(2)(f)(iv) , subject to final approval from the Cabinet Legislative Committee [CAB-24-MIN-0471.02 refers]. We are seeking your direction on these matters as well as on transitional provisions to inform the final drafting instructions.

Allocating Functions to Local Boards

As noted, Cabinet agreed to an indicative set of functions for local boards, with the Minister of Transport authorised to make policy decisions on the final allocation of functions to local boards, and on which roads local boards will have decision-making rights over [CAB-24-MIN-0471.02 refers].

Allocation of decision-making

- 24 Functions have been allocated between the Governing Body and local boards of Auckland Council.
- 25 We have refined the indicative list of functions for local boards as agreed by Cabinet through considering a broad range of RCA functions under the Land Transport Act 1998 (LTA 1998), as well as transport responsibilities under specific transport rules and the Local Government Act 1974 (LGA 1974) provisions. As noted, moving forward, Auckland Council becomes the RCA (inclusive of the Governing Body and local boards), not Auckland Transport as is currently.
- 26 Decision-making for local boards has been determined by considering functions that are related to identity of place, enable community engagement, or are decisions that should be made closer to the affected communities. Decisions that require regional consistency of operations, network planning across the region, or require regional setting of fees and fines, have been allocated to the Governing Body.
- 27 The decision-making for local boards, as set out in Appendix B Table 1, will be allocated through legislation as per Cabinet direction. Appendix B Table 2 has been included to show the decision-making that will sit with the Governing Body.

The Governing Body and local boards can delegate the decisions that they are responsible for to the transport CCO, while ensuring that the intent of the reforms, to have a more narrowly focused transport CCO, remains.



- agreed that the Auckland Regional Transport Committee must consult with Auckland Council (the Governing Body of Auckland Council and local boards) on the draft Regional 9 Land Transport Plan prior to public consultation,
- 10 agreed that the Regional Land Transport Plan prepared by the Auckland Regional Transport Committee must:
 - have regard to the Auckland Council Long-term Plan, the most recent draft or final; 10.1
 - 10.2 have regard to any separate Auckland Council transport policy statement agreed by the Auckland Council Governing Body;
 - be consistent with the 30-year integrated transport plan agreed between Cabinet and 10.3 Auckland Council;
- 11 noted that the Land Transport Management Act 2003 already requires that Regional Land Transport Plans are consistent with the Government Policy Statement on Land Transport;
- 12 agreed that Auckland Council is responsible for regional transport policies and plans except for those undertaken by the Auckland Regional Transport Committee;
 - agreed that Auckland Council is the Auckland Road Controlling Authority;

noted that Auckland Council is made up of both the Governing Body (Mayor and 20 councillors) and 21 local boards, and both will perform Road Controlling Authority functions as appropriate;

- 16 agreed that local boards are allocated specific transport decision-making functions in legislation that will apply to specific classifications of roads;
- 17 agreed that the functions described in Appendix 1 to the paper under CBC-24-SUB-0110 are an indicative set of functions that could be allocated to local boards, subject to final amendments prior to drafting decisions;
- CT 1982 authorise the Minister of Transport to make drafting decisions on the final allocation of 18 functions to local boards and on which roads local boards will have decision-making rights over:
- noted that the delegated drafting decisions of the Minister of Transport will be subject to 19 final approval by the Cabinet Legislation Committee;
- agreed that Auckland Council's Governing Body can also allocate or delegate transport 20 decision-making to local boards;

- authorise the Minister of Transport to agree to the consequential amendments to the Act, 23 and to report back to the Cabinet Legislation Committee on the outcome of those decisions;
- agreed to add a Land Transport (Auckland Governance) Amendment Bill to the 2024 Legislation Programme with a category 6 priority (drafting instructions to be issued to the 24 Parliamentary Counsel Office by the end of 2024);
- invited the Minister of Transport to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel 25 Office to give effect to the decisions under CAB-24-MIN-0471.02 for primary and any associated secondary legislation, including any necessary consequential amendments, savings and transitional provisions;
- 26 authorised the Minister of Transport to make decisions that are consistent with the overall policy, including to make any minor or technical changes that arise during the drafting of legislative amendments to reflect the decisions under CAB-24-MIN-0471.02.

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
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

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

Hi Abby

Following on from our discussion on the Minister for Auckland cabinet paper I realise I have a few questions on the scope of the work detailed below (extracted from your email to me on 6 May). Some of our internal discussions had led me to understand we were keeping the scope to the RLTP but on re-reading your wording it is worded broadly and as noted in our discussion the Minister is talking in the media about working with the Mayor to improve the accountability of Auckland Transport. Some specific questions in red.

I am meeting with Auckland Council on Monday and so some confirmation of scope prior would be useful. Helen mentioned we might need a discussion with the Minister - if that is the case I'd ideally prefer to be directly involved

- The Minister would like advice from the Ministry (working with Auckland Council) that examines the pros and cons of different options for the governance and oversight of transport decision making in Auckland (this is more than the RLTP) covering the following options:
 - Status Quo (including examination of whether existing levers are being fully used) levers in general over AP or levers specifically related to the development and approval of the RLTP?)
 - Reconsider RL ownership (e.g. move from AT to AC).



 Explore Mayoral executive powers for AT. (is this powers over AT in general to get more accountability/also the Mayor/Minister meeting notes talked about looking at the role the Minister has with NZTA and how that might apply to the Mayor and AT – some guidance here would be useful) Ngā mihi Karen

Dear Minister,

Thank you for meeting me today. I enjoy our regular catch-ups and hope you do as well

Transport Governance Reform

We agreed that the culture of independence pervading Auckland Transport is unacceptable, and that Aucklanders deserve better.

We agreed that there needs to be more work done on options which include:

- a) Move responsibility for the Regional Land Transport Rlan (RLTP) into Auckland Council;
- b) Explore what additional powers could be given to Auckland Council and the Mayor to exercise control over Auckland Transport;
- c) Repeal or change Part 4 of the Local Government (Auckland Council) Act relating to AT's independence and role in planning, strategy and other aspects of the transport system, as opposed to being purely a delivery agency, which is all it should be.

Your officials and Auckland Council officials will work together, and report back to us by **Friday 30 August 2024**. I would ask that you direct your officials to engage as fully and openly as possible with our officials on this work.

I strongly believe that the Regional Transport Committee should be comprised of democratically-elected councillors, plus representatives of NZTA and KiwiRail, following the current practice in other local authorities.

Auckland Integrated Transport Plan

You indicated Audrey Sonerson the Secretary for Transport will engage with our chief executive Phil Wilson to develop a draft terms of reference for the AITP, following its inclusion in the GPS.

I look forward to us both receiving a progress update on this **Friday 2 August 2024**. We will need to prepare something at pace for endorsement by our respective colleagues.

There will be areas where we agree, and areas where we will not. I expect the terms of reference will reflect that, in order to enable a constructive discussion on the integrated plan.

Time of Use Charging

You and I agreed "loud and clear" that the purpose of any time of use charging scheme is for demand management, not necessarily for revenue generation.

I look forward to our officials engaging throughout the progress of legislation being developed, and reiterate it would be preferable for our officials to work together as early in the process as possible. This would mean we are as closely aligned as possible, as the scheme design publicly progresses. I would appreciate an update on timing, so we can confidently direct our officials.

Temporary Traffic Management

Thank you for receiving my report on Temporary Traffic Management, and for taking up my 'War on Cones'. I appreciate there is a whole-of-government approach needed to reducing TTM cost and inconvenience, and suggest that as you progress work on fee and charge reform, TTM fines and fees could be included there, rather than over-complicating things. I agree with you that there needs to be clearer guidance on the types of activities where cones are simply unnecessary. I look forward to work ng with you, as much of this requires legislative change, which is something you can help with.

KiwiRail

Aucklanders are still complaining to me about delays and cancellations on our rail network. I was very concerned to be told when CRL opens, there will be **more Temporary** Speed Restrictions' than there are now, meaning average TSR delays will go up, to possibly 5 minutes when CRL opens.

This is simply unacceptable, and I hope the review of the Metropolitan Rail Operating Model will figure out a way through this. KiwiRail do not seem to have the right incentives in place.

You also seemed receptive to my criticisms of quoted reliability numbers. If the network is reliable in the middle of the night, when there are no commuters, but heavily disrupted during peak time when tens of thousands of Aucklanders are trying to get to work, this is not truly reflective of the network reliability. It should be measured based on reliability and peak demand being in the same sentence.
