I refer to your request dated 8 April 2022, pursuant to the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), seeking

- 1. A list of all agencies (public and private) with whom you either have a formal or informal partnership with (and state which) regarding border security matters.
- 2. A brief description (one sentence) of the purpose of that relationship.

As the Act only applies to information that is already held by Ministers or agencies, and there is no obligation to create information in order to respond to requests, I am refusing your request under section 18(g) of the Act as this information is not held. The information you are seeking would need to be created in order to meet your request.

I can, however, confirm that the Te Manatū Waka Ministry of Transport does engage with border agencies on border security matters through the Border Executive Board (BEB), chaired by the New Zealand Customs Service (Customs). The six agencies involved in the BEB include Customs, Te Manatū Waka, the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE), the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT), the Ministry of Health (MoH), and the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI). Te Manatū Waka also chairs the Maritime Security Oversight Committee (MSOC) as the lead agency for maritime security policy. The 10 other agencies involved in MSOC are Maritime New Zealand; the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet; MBIE; the Ministry of Defence; MFAT; Customs; New Zealand Defence Force; New Zealand Police; MPI; and Department of Conservation.
