

NEW ZEALAND TRANSPORT AGENCY: CABINET PAPER TO PROGRESS CHAIR APPOINTMENT

Purpose

This briefing seeks your agreement to lodge the attached papers for the Cabinet Appointments and Honours (APH) Committee, outlining your intention to appoint Hon Simon Bridges as Chair of the New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA or the Agency) Board.

Key points

- In response to briefing OC240087, you agreed to progress the appointment of Hon Simon Bridges as the Chair of the NZTA Board for a three-year term.
- The papers required to finalise this appointment are attached to this briefing.
 Appendix One and Two.

Appointment timing

- You have indicated that you would like this appointment to be progressed as soon as practicable for the next available APH Committee meeting. The next available meeting is on Tuesday 27 February, with Cabinet confirmation taking place on 4 March 2024.
- To meet these timeframes, the items included in **Appendix One** and **Two** will need to be lodged by 10am on Thursday 22 February 2024.
- The Ministry proposes a start date of 11 March 2024, if the APH Committee and Cabinet confirm the proposed appointment.

Actions underway

- We are in the process of undertaking referee and background checks. A summary of results to date will be provided in advance of the APH meeting, and the APH paperwork notes that the appointment is subject to a satisfactory background check being completed.
- Mr Bridges has also provided his written consent and disclosure form. No new disclosures have been made since the interview. He has spoken with the Auckland Business Chamber Board about his candidacy, and they are supportive of this appointment.

At your request, the Ministry will undertake statutory industry consultation on your behalf between the APH Committee and Cabinet meetings. This will be conducted with the list of representative stakeholders provided in OC240087 pending further feedback. A summary of feedback will be provided in advance of the Cabinet meeting.

NEW ZEALAND TRANSPORT AGENCY: CHAIR APPOINTMENT

Proposal

This paper outlines my intention to appoint the Honourable Simon Joseph Bridges as a member and Chair of the New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA or the Agency) Board, for a three-year term commencing on the date of appointment.

Background

- NZTA is a Crown agent under the Crown Entities Act 2004 and established by the Land Transport Management Act 2003 (the Act). Its core functions are:
 - 2.1 planning land transport networks
 - 2.2 investing in land transport
 - 2.3 managing the State highway network
 - 2.4 providing access to, and use of, the land transport system.
- 3 The Agency's statutorily independent functions are to:
 - 3.1 determine whether certain activities should be included in the National Land Transport Programme
 - 3.2 approve activities as qualifying for payment from the National Land Transport Fund
 - 3.3 approve procurement procedures for land transport activities
 - 3.4 issue or suspend any land transport document or authorisation
 - 3.5 enforce any provisions relating to its functions.
- 4 Under section 98 of the Act, the NZTA Board must have at least seven, but no more than nine members appointed by the Minister of Transport. Under Schedule 5 of the Crown Entities Act 2004, the responsible Minister may appoint one of the members as Chairperson.
- There are currently seven members of the NZTA Board, following the resignation of Dr Paul Reynolds and Patrick Reynolds on 6 December 2023. A list of the current membership is attached.

Comment

- I intend to appoint the Honourable Simon Joseph Bridges as a member and Chair of the NZTA Board.
- 7 Mr Bridges replaces Dr Reynolds, who previously served as Chair of NZTA. Deputy Chair Cassandra Crowley has acted in the Chair's role since Dr Reynolds resignation, and I thank her for her service in that role during this period.
- Simon Bridges is a former Cabinet Minister whose current roles include Chief Executive of Auckland Business Chamber, Chair of the National Road Carriers' Chief Executive Advisory Board, and the Chair of the Northern Infrastructure Forum.
- I consider that he will bring a collaborative style of leadership to the Board, as well as a strong public service ethos and work ethic. As a former transport Minister, he is familiar with the issues faced by the Agency as well as the work required to lead the Agency in its delivery of Government priorities. He is also adept in networking and building professional relationships and is excited about the economic development opportunities that can be created through the Agency.
- Mr Bridges advises that he intends to resign from his roles on National Road Carriers and Northern Infrastructure Forum if appointed. He has also committed to refraining from making any public statements on transport in his capacity as Chamber Chief Executive and has agreed strategies with the Chamber's Board to manage perceptions of any conflict of interest.

Representativeness of appointment

- I am satisfied the appointment of the Honourable Simon Bridges as Chair will provide for a well-balanced Board in terms of gender, ethnicity, age, geographic representation, and an appropriate mix of skills and experience.
- The appointment of Mr Bridges will result in the board having an equal split of male and female members, a range of ages between mid 40s and early 70s, and two members who identify as New Zealand Māori. Five members are based in urban centres and three members are based in regional towns. Only one member, however, is based in the South Island.
- The collective experience across the Board also covers central and local government knowledge, funding, audit and risk, regulation, land transport engineering, and community perspectives.

Remuneration

The Board is classified as a Group 3a Level 1 Governance Board under the Cabinet Fees Framework. The current fee for the Chair is \$78,540 per annum, which is consistent with the Fees Framework.

Appointment process and consultation

- I can confirm an appropriate process has been followed in selecting the proposed appointee, in terms of the Te Kawa Mataaho Public Service Commission's *Board Appointments and Induction Guidelines*. In summary, that process included:
 - 15.1 public advertising of the Chair role, including a detailed position description, on the Ministry of Transport's website, LinkedIn and The Treasury's Board Appointments Database
 - 15.2 seeking nominations from a variety of sources including the Ministry for Women, Te Puni Kōkiri, Ministry for Pacific Peoples, Ministry for Ethnic Communities, Office for Disability Issues, Public Service Commission, caucus colleagues and other networks
 - 15.3 identifying suitable candidates and undertaking due diligence interviews, referee and other background checks, as well as consultation with coalition partners.
- In addition, section 98(2) of the Act requires that "the responsible Minister must not appoint a board member unless he or she has consulted with the persons, representative groups within the land transport sector or elsewhere, government departments, and Crown entities that he or she considers appropriate." In accordance with this section, the Ministry of Transport will consult the following parties on my behalf following this meeting:
 - New Zealand Automobile Association
 - Bus and Coach Association New Zealand,
 - Civil Contractors New Zealand
 - Local Government New Zealand,
 - Motor Industry Association of New Zealand,
 - Motor Trade Association.
 - New Zealand Heavy Haulage Association,
 - Ia Ara Aotearoa Transporting New Zealand (formerly the Road Transport Forum),
- 17 I will provide a verbal update on feedback received at Cabinet.

Conflicts of interest

- I can confirm appropriate enquiries concerning conflicts of interest have been carried out, in accordance with the Te Kawa Mataaho Public Service Commission's *Board Appointments and Induction Guidelines*, to identify any conflict of interest that could reasonably be identified.
- Simon Bridges is currently Chief Executive of the Auckland Business Chamber, Chair of the National Road Carriers' Chief Executive Advisory Board, and the Chair of the Northern Infrastructure Forum. All present conflicts of interest to various degrees.
- 20 Mr Bridges has advised that he will resign from his roles on the National Road Carriers Advisory Board and Northern Infrastructure Forum if appointed.

- 21 Potential conflicts arising from his role as Chief Executive of the Auckland Business Chamber were discussed with Ministry of Transport officials. Based on the information provided, I am satisfied that there is no direct conflict of interest. This is because the Auckland Business Chamber has a strong delivery focus rather than a policy focus, with advocacy on transport being led by the Northern Infrastructure Forum and the Employers and Manufacturers Association. Ministry of Transport officials noted the Chamber was an active advocate on transport issues during the tenure of Mr Michael Barnett, but Mr Bridges advised that this has not continued under his tenure. The Chamber doesn't have a work programme on transport issues.
- If appointed, Mr Bridges has committed to refrain from making any public statements on transport in his capacity as Chamber Chief Executive. He has discussed his candidacy and proposed mitigations with his Board, who are supportive.
- The NZTA Board has strategies in place to manage any conflicts of interest which may arise, including relevant Board members withdrawing from discussions where appropriate. Any conflicts which may arise can be managed in accordance with NZTA's existing practices.

Timing and Publicity

A media statement may be issued if the appointment is confirmed, and Hon Bridges has been notified. Hon Bridges's appointment will also be published in the *New Zealand Gazette* as per the requirements of the Crown Entities Act 2004.

Recommendation

It is recommended the Committee notes my intention to appoint The Honourable Simon Joseph Bridges as a member and Chair of the NZTA Board for a three-year term of office commencing on the date of appointment, subject to satisfactory background checks.

The Honourable Simon Bridges is a former Cabinet Minister, with his Ministerial portfolios including Minister of Transport (2012-17), Energy Communications, Economic Development and Leader of the House. During his tenure as Minister, he rolled-out nation-building infrastructure like Ultra-Fast Broadband, saw construction start on the Peka Peka to Ōtaki, Puhoi to Warkworth and Waikato Expressway projects, and opened major new roads like the Waterview Tunnel. He also implemented policies during this period to grow the electric vehicle market as well as investments to improve public transport options in New Zealand.

Since leaving politics Mr Bridges has remained involved in the transport sector including governance roles as the Chair of the National Road Carriers' Chief Executive Advisory Board, and Chair of the Northern Infrastructure Forum. He is the current Chief Executive of Auckland Business Chamber.

As a former transport Minister, he is familiar with the issues faced by the Agency as well as the work required to lead the Agency in its delivery of Government priorities. 

Items

1a. ERP2 delivery - process and timeline

Context

The second emissions reduction plan (ERP2) is a legislated delivery mechanism for the Government's collective climate change programme to achieve the second emissions budget. It can also ensure New Zealand is on a path towards meeting subsequent emissions budgets and our 2050 targets.

Meeting our Climate Change targets provides an economic opportunity. Investing in our response now through renewable energy and innovation can deliver jobs and economic growth, whilst helping to meet changing international expectations and regulatory requirements for better access to key markets prioritising lower emissions products.

Prior to the legally required consultation on ERP2, the Minister of Climate Change also 9(2)(f)(iv)


The Government must publish ERP2 by 31 December 2024. This timeframe is tight. Relevant agencies and Ministers will need to prioritise this work. Cabinet will also need to allocate time to consider documents for consultation and publication. Forming a clear agreement across Government in the early part of 2024 is crucial for developing the shape and scope of ERP2 and instructing relevant agencies to prioritise this work.


The Government has a legal responsibility to consider advice from the Climate Change Commission. The advice contains recommendations in chapters on the transport and energy sectors, which are being led by MBIE and MOT. MfE will run a process to support agencies to do this, but Ministers will need to be involved in the relevant chapters.


Ministerial governance has been established to drive delivery and responsibility for the Government's climate change mitigation and adaptation priorities. The first CPMG meeting has tentatively been scheduled for late February and will be chaired by Minister Watts. Minister Brown's participation will be important as some of the more complex challenges New Zealand faces in meeting climate targets fall within the energy and transport portfolios.

Dear Simeon,

Delivering our Government's climate priorities - Energy and Transport portfolio bilateral

As you are aware, the Government sees climate change as an economic priority and is absolutely committed to meeting New Zealand's climate targets.

In light of this commitment our Government has a number of key priorities to deliver the emissions reductions needed to meet the climate targets, including:

9(2)(f)(iv)

We need to move quickly to action the delivery of these commitments, and 2024 will be a critical year for the Government to design and publish our climate mitigation implementation plan. Your support will be critical to transitioning the Energy and Transport sectors to a low carbon economy.

Given the cross-portfolio nature of the Government's climate work programme, I wish to meet with you early in 2024 to:

- 1. discuss and agree the climate priorities within your portfolio;
- 2. map out key deliverables and timeframes for those commitments,
- 3. discuss how we can most effectively work together to deliver our shared objectives.

My office will be in touch with your office shortly to find a time for us to meet in January if possible.

I look forward to working closely with you this term.
